architecture and integration of artwork for the renovation and expansion of Barton Pump Station located immediately adjacent to the Fauntleroy Ferry Terminal on Puget Sound. This project also included restoration of an adjoining residential property and Fauntleroy Cove Park which shares the pump station site. OPG worked closely with the Fauntleroy Neighborhood Association to re-create the community park and beach access, which includes access to a canoe/kayak launch area. Working closely with local

sculptor and artist Tom Jay, five new major art sculptures were introduced in addition to two salvaged sculptures. The stream echo, pictured above, is a braided stream pattern that extends the length of the beach access path. The irregular running pattern was created using three colors of concrete to reflect fisheries streams in the Pacific Northwest.
